Rules and Regulations

1. Judges decisions are final. No person may approach a judge regarding a decision or other matters without first obtaining consent from the Steward. Anyone disregarding this rule may be asked to cancel all entries and will forfeit all entry fees.
2. The Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide the classes when deemed necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
3. Horse/rider combos may only show at one height
4. Hunter and Equitation Classics will be run with a first round jumping score to count for 75% of the final score. The top 12 riders from the first round will return for an under saddle for the hunters and flat class for the Equitation to count for 25% of the final score.
5. A trophy and 6 ribbons will be awarded in all classes unless otherwise stated.
6. No numbers taken for warm-up after 8 am.
7. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise stated.
8. Entry Fee: Medal classes \$30. Leadline Classics, Walk trot Classics and Hunter Pleasure Classics \$40. All Hunter Classics and Equitation Classics \$65. Warm up fee \$25.00, Post entry fee: \$25. Returned check fee \$50
9. Indoor Arena 70x170. Outdoor arena 100 x 200 with ggt footing. Schooling permitted in authorized areas only. Anyone found violating this rule will forfeit fees and not be allowed to show.
10. Post Entries accepted the day of the show with \$25 post entry fee. No penalty for adding additional classes the day of the show.
11. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.

Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

12. Dogs must be leashed at all times on Graystone property.

13. Exhibitors or trainers found cleaning out their trailers onto the grounds will be charged a \$50 grounds fee- NO CLEANING OUT TRAILERS, PLEASE.

14. It is compulsory for all persons when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured.

15. The committee reserves the right to vary or change horse show officials or judges. Warning- Under Maine law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities.
